



For people who enjoy murder and archeology, there is an interesting series called **The Ruth Galloway Series**, by Elly Griffiths. Even though it is a series each book can stand on its own. The first title in this 15 book series is *The Crossing Places* (2009). The mysteries take place in east coastal England where there are lots of archeological sites to serve as locales for the stories. While the stories are fictional, some of the settings are steeped in actual history, so it is fun investigating fact from fiction as you progress through the various plots. 
