Patti Nitterhouse is our guest speaker this year providing an update on future community plans.





This year, for the first time, there will be a separate flight just for the Veterans (you must have a DD-214 to participate in this Flight). Everyone else will play as they have in previous years. All Penn National residents are welcome!! When signing up, please indicate which service you prefer to play for. If your father, sibling, child, etc. served or is serving, you may want to represent them. We make every effort to keep members who participated in past years on the same teams as before. The format is Ryder Cup with nine holes of 2-person scramble, nine holes of 2-person best ball, nine holes of 2-person alternating shot, and the final nine holes are head-to-head individual play. This is a handicap event; we do ask that you have an established handicap. We can work, on a case-by-case basis, with individuals who do not or cannot get a handicap.

You do not have to play both days, sign up for either day or for both days. If you have someone specific you wish to play with please let us know when you sign up. The husband/wife alternating shot portion has previously been an interesting dynamic.

Details for the "banquet" after golf on the final day are being worked on, expect a nominal charge to participate to cover the cost of food.

The remaining funds will be donated to a veterans-affiliated charity. Last year everyone's participation resulted in our ability to donate \$1,200 to the Folds of Honor. This organization provides college scholarships to the dependents of our fallen soldiers and first responders.

PN HARMONY SINGERS

MAY GREETINGS from THE PENN NATIONAL HARMONY SINGERS

The Harmony Singers performed at the Five Forks Brethren in Christ Church on April 15th. They requested a brief summary about our choir. This was an opportunity to do a little research about the Penn National Harmony Singers. John Berger, our choir treasurer, did some digging through old photos, articles and programs about the choir and now we have a history to share when we are asked about the choir and how we got started. 'Thank You' John for all your work. We would like to share this with the community.

The Penn National Harmony Singers started in 1997 with a group of women, gathered by Shirley Henrickson, who were residents of the Penn National community. The original idea was to get a group together for fellowship and singing. The group met for practice at St. Luke Lutheran church on route 997 in Fayetteville. The music director at St. Luke was a young man named Chris Furry, and he also served as the choirs' musical director. Their first music came from a book titled 'Introduction to Barbershop Music'.

By 1998 men had started to join the choir and the choir hired a music teacher, Tim Landis who worked at Shalom Christian School. Tim transitioned the choir from barbershop to singing songs from the Fred Waring Song Book and music from My Fair Lady and the Sound of Music. It was at this early time the choir began community outreach and was invited to sing at Senior Care facilities in the Chambersburg area. Tim served as both director and accompanist. At a later time Nancy Crandall took over as accompanist. By 2004, Tim Landis moved on to become the pastor of a church in Elizabethtown. At that time Sharon (Allison) Rost became the Musical director and Pat Martin the accompanist of the choir.

In 2020 the Covid 19 pandemic struck and the choir curtailed its programs for two years. It was during this period of time that Sharon Rost moved to Florida. Mary Jo Bedsworth took over as the music director and Heidi Shenberger became the accompanist.

In 2000 I became a member of the choir and although we have added a variety of music and community venues our main objective is to share our love of music. Our Christmas Concert has become an annual tradition that started in 1999. In 2023 we added a Summer Concert which is becoming a new annual tradition.

Mark your calendar for JUNE 17th for our SUMMER CONCERT at 7:00pm at the New Guilford Brethren in Christ Church on Mont Alto Road.

FRANKLIN COUNTY MASTER GARDENER ANNUAL PLANT SALE MAY 17TH - 9 A.M. TO 1 P.M.

The Franklin County Master Gardeners plant sale is May 17th from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at 425 Franklin Farm Lane, Chambersburg. This free event will feature a variety of unique plants, educational activities, and exhibits from community organizations. Free parking available.

Rain or shine. Bring your carts, wagons & boxes! Vegetables, herbs, annual flowers, heirlooms, sun & shade perennials, trees, shrubs & native plants. Plant availability will be dependent on germination and plant condition. We will have an information & "Ask a Gardener" table. Also, soil test kits (\$10) & horse manure in buckets will be available. Beekeepers, Audubon, and 4-H community groups will be on hand. Cash, checks, and Visa/Mastercard are accepted. The proceeds will support Master Gardener educational outreach activities in Franklin County. More information please visit our plant sale website at https://extension.psu.edu/programs/master-gardener/counties/franklin/news/annual-plant-sale

This sale is more than a fundraiser. We work to meet the mission of our program - "to educate the public and our communities on best practices in sustainable horticulture and environmental stewardship".

How do we do this? Each perennial plant has a sign with the botanical name, description including if it is native, pollinator friendly, or drought resistant. More than 2,000 plants offered are locally grown and nurtured by Master Gardeners at their Franklin County homes. They have been divided, potted, and overwintered in our holding area. Plants offered for sale have survived the recent winter season and are ready to be transplanted.

Annual flowers, herbs, and vegetables are grown in our greenhouse. We include unusual varieties of heirloom plants usually not offered at local nurseries. Seeds saved from heirloom plants will produce the same plant the next year. Highlights this year include Japanese Climbing cucumbers, the unusual "Hairy Balls" milkweed, and the popular hybrid Phenomenal Lavender that is both hardy and fragrant.

The mid-May sale date offers the best time to plant in our area, past the last frost date (est. May 10 in Franklin County) and when soil temperatures are likely to be ready for transplants.

Garden Hotline volunteers will be available to answer your plant and gardening questions. During 2025 our volunteers are available every Tuesday and Thursday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. until September 30. Call 717-263-9226 or email franklinmg@psu.edu.

We invite you to come to the sale to not only buy plants but to learn about them. Our Master Gardeners are available to offer assistance for choosing among the plants offered plus provide tips on the best way to plant and care for those selected.






