White Rock Real Estate News Real estate leads are strong. Construction began on the Lahinch, the newest single-family neighborhood, located between holes 4 and 11 on the Iron Forge Golf course. Lahinch will include 57 homesites and is a maintenance-association neighborhood with golf and mountain views. The project will be developed in phases and sales will not begin until 2026. The entrance to the new Lahinch neighborhood will be off St. Annes Drive near the Community Garden. The community garden will be minimally impacted this season and will be relocated near the Barn for the 2026 growing season.

All of those purchasing from realtors other than White Rock should reach out to the courthouse to obtain the protective covenants document for Penn National.

The manor house begins its history with Adam Ross, an Irish immigrant, who purchased the land from William and John Penn in 1789 and called it "Rosscommon." Adam Ross married Jane Chambers, the daughter of Colonel Benjamin Chambers, the founder of Chambersburg. Adam ross built the two-story Georgian manor house for his bride around 1820.
